Welcome Back!

Welcome back to the start of another busy term. Hopefully, you all had a lovely break with your families. The children have come back with enthusiasm, ready to take on any challenges which come their way, which is fantastic. This term, we are welcoming two new members of staff to Longman's Hill- Miss Davis and Mrs Dransfield, who will work as teaching assistants in Y3 and Y2 respectively.

Wraparound Provision

Last term Phazers announced, at incredibly short notice, that they would no longer be operating at our school. New wraparound care is now on offer- Sparkles Day Nursery, which is fully Ofsted registered, is able to offer before and after school care for children at our school. Children can be dropped off at their nursery, in town, from 7.30am and staff will drive the children to school. They can also collect children at 3.15pm, drive them back to the nursery, and can care for them until 5.30pm. Mandy Almond is the owner and also manages the facility on a day-to-day basis. All staff are DBS checked and Ofsted have registered the nursery, following visits to the site.

Reading Plus Programme - KS2

Children in KS2 have been set up with their own account on a reading programme we have bought licences for called Reading Plus. The children have been using the programme in school and will have brought home a letter last week with more details. The programme is expensive but we feel it is a good investment as there is an abundance of evidence that, when used at least 3 times per week for 15/20 minutes, children's reading attainment accelerates. The programme develops vocabulary, reading fluency and comprehension- all essential skills to be an effective and confident reader. We hope that parents can provide support by encouraging the children to log on at home as often as possible and complete reading challenges. The children will not need any support whilst using the programme because every child is provided with an individual library of books to read, at a level suitable for them, following an intensive baseline assessment which they completed before Christmas. Reading using Plus counts towards children 7 times reading weekly challenge-let's aim for a minimum of 3 sessions per week at home!

Y6 Booster Sessions

Miss Nicklin is running reading boosters (using Reading Plus) for children in Y6 between now and SATs in May. The sessions will run from 3.15-4.00pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, every week. A letter has already been sent out about this. Children can come to as many / few sessions as they like but we do need to know in advance which sessions children are signing up to. If you would like your child to be included in the booster sessions, and have not completed a consent form already, please contact school to get their name added to the club register. Thank you.

History quality mark

We are delighted to announce that once again, our school has been recognized for the superb quality of the curriculum we provide and have been awarded the History Quality Mark. This is a national accreditation and there is a lot of work that goes into getting it. Special thanks go to Miss Ramsay, our history lead, who worked very hard on the application process and setting up a school portfolio, showcasing what history looks like at Longman's Hill. The final stage of the process involved a full day inspection of history at the school- observing lessons, interviewing staff and children and scrutinizing work. Thanks to staff who were participants in the inspection day itself. We have been awarded the silver level; this is a fantastic achievement!
