Safe Parking

I appreciate that some parents may be weary of my constant mentions of parking at the school gates, however I am adding another polite request to the newsletter again today. As a school, we have taken several steps to try and reduce congestion and unsafe parking at the school gates, including petitioning the council to re-paint the yellow zig-zags, using cones/bollards and subscribing to the 'Living Streets' walk to school initiative.

However, we still have a considerable number of parents who choose to park at best inconsiderately and at worst, illegally and very unsafely for our children and families. It is illegal to park on the yellow zigzag lines and we would politely request that you do not do so. Whilst not illegal, it is also very inconsiderate to park right up on the pavements, as it prevents safe access for children walking to school.

I appreciate that everyone is busy at drop off / collection time; everyone has places to be and the temptation to think you'll just quickly park up to allow your child to jump in / out of the car can be great, I am sure. However, it is very inconsiderate and it is really only by luck that we have not had a child seriously injured, or worse. Please think before you park and let's work together as responsible adults to keep every child at our school safe on their journeys to and from school. Thank you in advance for your support.


Parental Warning- Safeguarding Concern about an online game 'Huggy Wuggy' and 'Poppy Playtime'

We have increasing numbers of children, including some in KS1, talking about playing on these games. Although the name of these games sounds innocent enough, parents may be unaware that these games contain some disturbing content. Poppy Playtime is a PC horror game that involves an unnamed protagonist investigating a mystery in an abandoned toy factory. As the player, you roam around the factory and collect VHS tapes to solve the mystery of what happened. You must solve puzzles while trying to survive the "vengeful toys" left

behind. "Huggy Wuggy" is one of the game's most popular - and visually disturbing - characters. It's a giant, horrifying blue creature with bulging eyes, wide red lips, and long limbs who actively follows you around as you try to complete the game. He appears in the dark unexpectedly to try and catch you. If you get caught, Huggy Wuggy bears his wide and sinister grin and eats you. In addition to the content of the game itself, Cyber Protection Officers have recently released a statement, warning parents that children may be viewing graphic fan-made videos that are popping up on platforms such as YouTube and TikTok. Some created videos feature songs alongside animation, designed to be upsetting and 'creepy'. Others feature jump-scare animations. The videos appear across several popular platforms, in particular on TikTok and YouTube. The hashtag 'huggywuggy' has over 2.9B views on TikTok.

Additionally, please be aware of another character called 'Siren Head' which some of our youngest children are also discussing; this character features in a set of short movies on YouTube and features some quite disturbing images.
